
I. Description of the Fund

Laborers' and Retirement Board Employees' Annuity and Benefit Fund of Chicago (LABF or Fund) was established in 1935 by the Illinois legislature and created to provide retirement and disability benefits to its members and their beneficiaries. The Funds' members include individuals who are employed by the City of Chicago in positions classified as "labor services," certain Board of Education members, and individuals employed by the Laborers', Policemen's and Firemen's Annuity and Benefit Funds.

The Fund's Board of Trustees administers benefits, manages the Fund's assets, and employs 20 full time staff members. All members of the Board of Trustees are fiduciaries with respect to the Fund and are statutorily mandated to discharge their duties as such solely in the interest of the Fund's participants and beneficiaries. LABF's annual administrative operating budget is approximately 3 million dollars. The Fund's Executive Director oversees all administrative functions and supervises the office staff.

Information that is available for public review can be requested under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA). The public can request information by writing a formal request to the LABF FOIA Officer at the following address:

Requests should include the requester's name, address, telephone number and a description of the records requested.

Generally, the Fund will respond to requests for information within five business days of receipt of the request. The FOIA Officer will contact the requester if additional time is needed to respond to the request. A fee will not be charged for the first 50 pages of a response. Additional pages will be assessed a fee of \$.05 per page. LABF may require that the fee be paid prior to preparing copies. Documents may also be requested in PDF format.
